6.0 SD23 PARTNER GROUP REPORTS

Trustee Update: Lee-Anne Tiede

• 2 Ministerial visits: Adrian Dix, (is a member of the Provincial Treasury Board, took him on

tour of RMS) and Minister of Education and Child Care Rachna Singh toured several SD23 facilities

- -Board spoke with both of them at length advocating for RMS
- Attended the last DSC meeting of the year, grateful for their leadership

Superintendent Update- Kevin Kaardal

- Encourage people to attend planning and facilities committee meetings, open to public and can also review meeting minutes highlights posted on district website
- RMS has been on the replacement list almost 20 years, and the government keeps denying our request, as there are other schools across B.C. that they consider higher priority than RMS.
- Government only replaces 1 school per year and there are 1,600 schools across BC with \$15 billion in requests for capital funding and only distribute about \$800,000 across B.C.
- Reimaging the request for RMS as renovation/new space
- Busy time of the year with lots of celebrations, with high school grads, Indigenous Blanket Ceremonies, grade 5/6 elementary celebrations
- Round of applause, thank you to our District Student Council for all their hard work this school year
- Thank you to all the parents actively involved in COPAC and PACs, supporting students and schools
- Year-end Superintendent Annual Report will be coming out end of June

Playground Equipment Program (PEP) priority list update- Nicola B. (June 7th planning & facilities committee agenda) 1. Belgo Elementary 2. South Rutland Elementary and 3. Helen Gorman Elementary

SD23 was not selected this year for the provincial PEP funding.

- Superintendent Kardaal commented that Action 4Canada members have been outside some of our schools handing out pamphlets, Principals have been notified that they are not allowed on school property.
 - -SD23 is working with the Ministry, law enforcement, and legal team to ensure we promote safe and inclusive school environments.
 - -If there is any vandalism plus the literature it can be constituted as Hate Crime, please report any incidents.

-Nicola spoke on behalf of CLE school community thanking the students from Canyon Falls Middle and OKM Secondary schools who came out to Chute Lake elementary to assist with a number of school community building events, Primary Mini Track Meet and the Carnival. Lots of PACs across the district engage students from their own extended family of schools to support events like these to help make them successful. And thank you to all the teachers in SD23 who support PAC events and especially the District Track & Field events, Robotics competitions and so much more that are not part of their normal jobs. Thank you to everyone in our district working together to create caring communities.

Question from RVE rep.

- -Regarding collecting receipts from Teachers to reimburse with PAC funds Answered by Roslyn H.: Rule of thumb is the more info collected for records is better. Receipts per classroom if you want to track itemized expenditures or a straight donation to the school as long as you have a record of it as a donation. It's important to make it clear to the teachers beforehand how you need it recorded.
- Simon reminded about the PST rebate Instruction guide emailed to PAC Presidents and COPAC reps, if you didn't receive it email copac.president@sd23.bc.ca
- -Simon encouraged using PAC dollars to align with needs based off your School Community Learning Plans, for example stronger outcomes for STEM, mathematics, reading/Writing Literacy, outdoor play/learning. The needs and goals will vary for each schools focus and this would be an example of how PACs can strategically align its spending with the priorities of the school.
