<u>Eligibility</u>

3. A person nominated for a position on the COPAC Executive must be a current member of the COPAC Executive, or a current PAC Representative to COPAC, or a person who has previously been a PAC Representative to COPAC, or is currently a PAC Executive Member and be the parent or guardian of a student enrolled in SD23 for the duration of the term of office. No employee of SD23 can hold an executive position due to potential perceived conflict of interest.
